



Big Ideas...So Far

There have already been two major public events held as part of the Sharonville 2030 planning project including the January Public Meeting at the Recreation Center followed by the April business networking event called Beers, Bites, and Big Ideas, held at the Sharonville Convention Center. At both events, participants were asked to identify their own Big Ideas for Sharonville that should be addressed in this planning process. Below is a list of the top ideas based on number of responses and/or priorities votes.

January Public Meeting

- Improve the streetscape around the downtown loop
- Create a gathering spot for the community
- Build and overpass/underpass for trains at key intersections
- Increase connectivity of sidewalks & paths
- More local restaurants (non-chains)
- Bigger recreation center with indoor pool
- Access to Sharon Woods from Cornell Road
- Downtown corridor plan
- Address traffic congestion
- Reuse railroad spur for vehicles and bikes
- Stronger regulations of land uses in downtown
- Eliminate one-way streets
- Lighting improvements citywide
- Public use of Mill Creek
- Create a community garden

April Beers, Bites, & Big Ideas

- More/better restaurants, breweries, wineries, retail, and farmers market
- More sidewalks and bike trails, with more connections to Sharon Woods
- Improvements to downtown including streetscape, businesses, and activities
- Host more community events for all
- Fix train conflicts with traffic
- Expand parks and recreation facilities
- Better signage and landscaping along the interstate and at bridges
- Improvements to Lebanon Road/Route 42, north of downtown
- More citywide beautification efforts
- Fix roads and infrastructure
- Expand the recreational center, include an indoor pool
- Develop affordable senior housing options, especially near downtown
